# Round-Up Award Winners are Very Special People

Jack & Elaine Holmes, retired middle school math teachers in Las Vegas, fell in love with the ruins of the Southwest. They've seen 90% of the famous ruins and many of the not-so-famous on their treks. From there it was an easy jump to rock art, which has been their major love ever since. Jack & Elaine are a major force for NRAF in the south and organize most of the recording projects down that way. NRAF is a better organization because of their effort and we wanted acknowledge the significance of their contribution by naming the *Holmes Volunteer of the Year* award in their honor.

The Lost City Museum was the recipient of the *Friends of the Foundation* award. LCM studies, preserves, and protects prehistoric Ancestral Pueblo (Anasazi) and other cultural sites and artifacts of Nevada. The museum was built by the National Park Service in 1935. Today, as part of the Nevada Department of Cultural Affairs, the museum strives to educate Nevada residents and visitors from around the world about the rich cultural history of Nevada. So, the next time you're in southern Nevada, make sure you drop in and say "thanks for all you do!"

The single parent of five boys, **Eileen Green** completed her bachelor's degree in archaeology while working full time at the post office. Her Master's Thesis, from UNLV, "A Cultural Ecological Approach to the Rock Art of Southern Nevada," remains an important resource. She is well known in the archaeological community for her many years of good work and her friends know her to be kind and sensitive – in addition to her "colorful personality." Eileen was the recipient of the **President's Award for Lifetime Achievement**, because she has inspired and continues to inspire archaeologists and rock art researchers alike with her enthusiasm and knowledge of Nevada's past and natural environment.

When it came time to select the recipient for the *Executive Directors Award for Exceptional Service*, NRAF Board of Directors Vice President Shari Chase was the clear choice. Through a chance encounter, she fell in love with rock art and the rest, so to speak, is history. The driving force behind the formation of the foundation, she continues to be a source of unwavering enthusiasm for NRAF's mission. at Lago and plans are proceeding for further



Vork resumed at Lagomarsino in May - this time led by Ralph & Cheryln Bennett! They learned first hand the difficulties of getting everyone in the car in the morning and in spite of forgetting a "few important items" managed to record a little over 100 panels, bringing our total to over 850! And we're starting to get a little spoiled by Jeff Thelen, who again provided lunch... Chinese BBQ Chicken Salad & Lasagna! How great is that? We plan on being on-site again through the month of October - so watch the NRAF News Flash! and Great Basin Glyph Notes for details. A mailer will be sent out in August, so if you want to participate, make sure you get to training and sign up early... this project always fills fast (especially now that word of Jeff's cooking is getting out). Our thanks to TRW caretaker Craig Prest for helping us gain access to the site across their property - and for showing us how to find another site in the same area that volunteers have already begun to record.

Dry Lakes – The first two sessions of this multiyear project were in June, 3-11 and again 25-28. Panels were photographed, mapped, drawn and inked –



leaving only around a million for next year – so make plans now to help out! Initial work will provide data for Signa Pendegraft's MA thesis, but will be followed up with additional data for the designation of an Area of Critical Environmental Concern by the BLM. This really is a unique area, with more than 100 rock art sites scattered in an 8 square mile area, only minutes from downtown Sparks. The rapid growth of the Reno/Sparks area and associated increase in recreational use of the area prompted the project and this area was also the first to have NRAF Site Stewards assigned.

How many bighorn sheep petroglyphs can fit into a 1.3-mile canyon? NRAF members investigated this and other questions in May at Little




Petroglyph Canyon in the Coso Range, located entirely on, and protected by, the Naval Air Weapons Station at China Lake, California. The weather was warm and clear, the Maturango Museum staff were world-class hosts, and the Navy didn't shoot at us. We were awed by the setting, the expert guidance of Ken Pringle, one of the original researchers of the Coso petroglyphs, and the impact of one of the world's largest concentrations of rock art. 
Our fondest thoughts are with **Al Ferrand** at this difficult time. We wish him all the strength he needs and all the love his friends and family can give him.

# Code of Ethics

The Nevada Rock Art Foundation subscribes to the following Code of Ethics and encourages its members, as a condition of membership, to abide by the standards of conduct stated herein.

- 1. NRAF members will be respectful at rock art sites many are regarded as sacred by indigenous peoples and as such will be treated as a valued part of our shared cultural heritage.
- 2. All local, state, and national antiquities laws will be strictly adhered to by the membership of NRAF.All research or educational activities taking place at rock art sites shall be subject to appropriate regulations and property access requirements.

- All rock art recording shall be nondestructive with regard to the rock art itself and the associated archaeological remains which may be present.
- 4. NO artifacts shall be collected unless the work is done as part of a legally constituted program of archaeological survey or excavation and with express permission of the land holder.
- 5. No excavation shall be conducted unless the work is done as part of a legally constituted excavation project and with the express permission of the land holder. Removal of soil shall not be undertaken at any time for the sole purpose of exposing subsurface rock art.
