# ARARA Is Coming to Town!

The American Rock Art Research Association will be having its annual meeting in Sparks, Nevada, May 28-30, 2005, locally hosted by the NEVADA ROCK ART

FOUNDATION, and held at John Ascuaga's Nugget. A lot of very exciting events are planned for this conference. Kicking things off is a public presentation at the Desert Research Institute by Polly Schaafsma, cosponsored by NRAF and AmArcs, on Thursday May 26. This well known author and researcher literally "wrote the book" on Great Basin rock art in her chapter on rock art in Vol. 11 of the Smithsonian Handbook of North American Indians. She will be presenting on her recent research in Utah and the greater Southwest, focusing on warfare themes in the rock art of that region.

Registration for the conference begins on Friday May 27, followed that evening by a reception at the Pyramid Lake Cultural Center. The PLCC is situated on the south end of beautiful Pyramid Lake and houses a museum

inside a uniquely designed building. Refreshments with a "local flair" and traditional stories told by Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribal Elder Ralph Burns are sure to make for a memorable evening. Papers and poster presentations begin on Saturday May 28 and in the evening is the now famous ARARA Auction at the Sparks Heritage Museum. The museum is just a few blocks from John Ascuaga's Nugget, so everyone can bid hard and have a leisurely stroll back with the fruits of their labor! Sunday May 29 is another day of papers, followed in the evening by a banquet at the Nugget where Polly Schaafsma will speak on issues that threaten rock art everywhere. And rounding out the conference on Monday May 30 is a day of site tours. Also on Monday morning, and new this year, is a photography workshop with instructors Steve Freers and Bob Mark. There will be a modest fee for this workshop, and if you've ever wanted to learn how to do a better job photographing rock art, now's your chance to learn. The popularity of the northern monthly Grimes Point tour has prompted NRAF to offer a monthly public tour in the south too. With the support of the Valley of Fire State Park, NRAF



now offers monthly public, educational tours to the rock art in the state park. Special thanks go out to the Southern Tour Guides Darwin Johnson, Charles Molina and Chuck Williams, who will lead the tours from November through May on the second Saturday. When the news hit the local paper and the LA Times, the tours filled up almost immediately! There's still a bit of room on the May tour (which we'll be doing as part of Archaeology Awareness & Historic Preservation Week, see Calendar of Events), but if you want to go—you'd better sign up fast!

And although things begin to slow down in the south as the warmer weather approaches, there will be additional training and projects this spring and in the fall. New and recent books of interest to NRAF members looking to adding to their library and learning more about rock art:

- Rock Art and Epistemology: Courting Sophistication, edited by Robert Bednarik, IFRAO Volume 3, Brepols, Turnhout, Belgium. This volume marks something of a departure for this series as previous volumes are intended to provide an essential reference for rock art researchers and enthusiasts alike. This volume represents a collection of papers, providing a representative sample of current approaches to the limits and possibilities of rock art interpretation. For those wanting a concise and accessible account of the various issues in rock art method and theory, Robert Bednarik's Rock Art Science. The Scientific Study of Palaeoart is highly recommended. This is volume 1 of the IFRAO series published by Brepols. Both books are available direct from the publisher; see the Brepols website www.brepols.net/publishers/index.html and do an online search of their catalog for further details.
- For those wanting a beautiful photographic record of rock art in the Colorado Plateau then Stone Chisel and Yucca Brush by Ekkehart Malotki and Donald Weaver is the book for you. This is a handsomely presented coffee table book containing over 200 plates of spectacular photography of rock art from Arizona, Colorado, New Mexico and Utah. Published in 2002 by Kiva Press this book is available from most bookshops.
- Polly Schaafsma will be signing copies of her books after her May 26 public presentation in Reno. She is a well-published author and authority on Great Basin and Southwestern rock art. Her most recent book Warrior, Shield, and Star: Imagery and Ideology of Pueblo Warfare, Western Edge Press, 2000, explores the ideology of Puebloan warfare through rock art imagery and is the topic of her public talk on May 26.



# Code of Ethics

The Nevada Rock Art Foundation subscribes to the following Code of Ethics and encourages its members, as a condition of membership, to abide by the standards of conduct stated herein.

- 1. NRAF members will be respectful at rock art sites many are regarded as sacred by indigenous peoples and as such will be treated as a valued part of our shared cultural heritage.
- 2. All local, state, and national antiquities laws will be strictly adhered to by the membership of NRAF.All research or educational activities taking place at rock art sites shall be subject to appropriate regulations and property access requirements.

- All rock art recording shall be nondestructive with regard to the rock art itself and the associated archaeological remains which may be present.
- 4. NO artifacts shall be collected unless the work is done as part of a legally constituted program of archaeological survey or excavation and with express permission of the land holder.
- 5. No excavation shall be conducted unless the work is done as part of a legally constituted excavation project and with the express permission of the land holder. Removal of soil shall not be undertaken at any time for the sole purpose of exposing subsurface rock art.
